



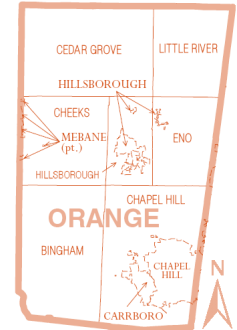

# HUD Funding in Orange County

# HUD block grants Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) to larger communities & State



- No ESG entitlement in Orange County
- Orange County is a subrecipient of ESG funds via the State ESG Office, who receives ESG funds from HUD
  - Local process to determine priorities and recommended funded projects

# CoC funds run through CoCs

Priorities, eligibility



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Nonprofits, Govt. agencies, Public Housing Authorities

Project applications

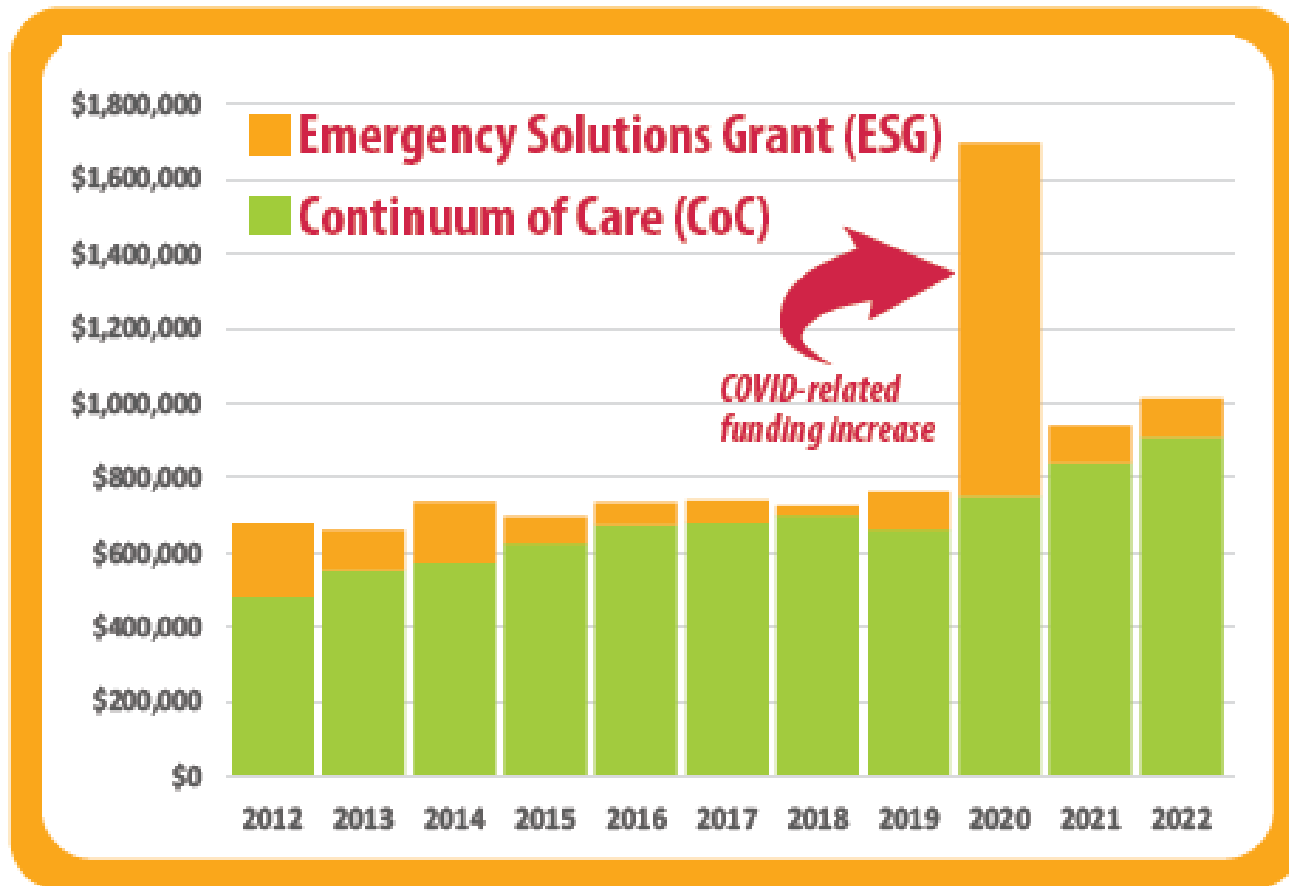
CoC App has 3 parts

# The Role of the Project Review Committee and Leadership Team

# Both OCPEH Leadership Team and Project Review Committee (PRC) involved

- Project Review Committee
  - Reviews applications
  - Develops recommendations
- Leadership Team
  - Makes final decisions on recommended funded projects



# The Charge (part 1)

- The Continuum of Care is established to carry out responsibilities in the HUD CoC Program Interim Rule (24 CFR Part 578)
  - Governance and Structure
  - System Operations and Planning
  - Preparing an Annual Application for CoC and ESG funds
  - Designating and Operating HMIS
  - Coordinated Entry

# The Charge (part 2)

- Governance Charter

- Art. I, Sec. 5 – The Partnership, through the Project Review Committee and Leadership Team
  - Establish Funding Priorities
  - Establish project application rating and ranking tools
  - Establish a transparent and inclusive process for each funding opportunity

# The Charge (part 3)

- Governance Charter

- Art. V, Sec. 9 – The Leadership Team will designate members of the standing PRC that do not have ties to agencies subject to review by the PRC to
  - Program monitoring, including data review
  - Establish rating and ranking tool for new and renewal projects
  - Formulate proposed project priority listings

Wednesday 9/14	OCPEH staff notify project applicants in writing whether projects included in Orange CoC application	15 days
Friday 9/23	Project applications revisions complete	
Wednesday 9/28	OCPEH staff posts CoC application on OCPEH website (CoC community application, project priority listing and project applications)	2 days
Friday 9/30	OCPEH sends completed CoC application (CoC community application, project priority listing and project applications) to HUD in advance of competition deadline	

# Guiding Priorities

- HUD Thresholds

- Coordinated Entry Participation
- Housing First and / or Low Barrier Implementation
- Documented, secured minimum match
- Reasonable costs per exit
- Financially feasible
- Active CoC Participant
- Application is complete
- Data Quality is at or above 90%
- Acceptable financial review / experience utilizing public funds

# Guiding Priorities

- Local Scorecard

- To not displace people currently housed in CoC and ESG funded programs
- Maximize additional funding
- Fill System Gaps
- Housing First programming
- Program effectiveness
- Racial equity in agency / program goals and performance review
