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



Who's Experiencing Homelessness?



Average Days Homeless

(FY2021 - FY2023)

Between the fiscal years of 2021 - 2023 there is a **9.55%** decrease in the average days homeless in Orange County, NC

Stella - Performance (Stella-P)



WHAT IS STELLA-P?

• HUD's Stella Performance Module: Stella P, captures visualizations of CoC's Longitudinal Systems Analysis (LSA) data to illustrate how households move through the homeless system and highlight outcome disparities

 Stella P looks at system-level performance for three critical performance measures:

- Number of days homeless (Days Homeless)
- Exits from the homeless system to permanent destinations (Exits)
- Returns to the homeless system after exits to permanent destinations (Returns)







Exits From the Homeless System


(FY2021 - FY2023)

Between the fiscal years of 2021-2023 the average percentage of households that exited to permanent destinations include:

Adults Only: 20.33% Adults and Children: 69%







Returns to the Homeless System




Returns to the Homeless System

(FY2021 - FY2023)

Between the fiscal years of 2021-2023 the average percentage of households that returned to the homeless system after exiting between 12 and 24 months prior to the Current Report Period is listed below:

Adults Only: 8% Adults and Children: 4.67%





Returns by Race and Ethnicity


Percent and number of households in each race and ethnicity group that exited the homeless system, and percent and number of exiting households in each group who returned within six months.

 Today, we are looking at the HH that <u>exited</u> between 12 and 24 months prior to the Current Report Period









Gaps

- Race and Ethnicity only includes the head of household (HoH) and adults
- Stella-P does not account for
 - Individuals who have not accessed services
 - Individuals who are being helped by projects not affiliated with the Orange County/Chapel Hill CoC

ORANGE COUNTY

HOUSING DEPARTM

- Stella-P does not include ALL pathways for exiting homelessness.
- In some areas on Stella-P, the number of people is too small to be meaningfully represented statistically.
