- Coordinated Entry Roundtables – CE Planning committee will be evaluating access to homeless system referrals via peer-led Roundtables in May and June. Community members currently or formerly experiencing homelessness will be compensated with HUD CoC Planning grant funds.

 - FY24-25 Budget update – The four elected boards are considering the [Partnership's Expansion request](#). The Expansion request includes continuation funding for Partnership operations, SOHRAD, a portion of Rapid Rehousing not covered by HUD grants, and adds funding for Bridge Housing for people exiting jail / prisons via Coordinated Entry and a portion of Housing Helpline not covered by HUD grants. Managers will be presenting their recommended budgets in the coming weeks.
 - Unsheltered encampment update – OCPEH has been working with partners to support people living unsheltered in Carrboro. An encampment of unsheltered neighbors near Jones Ferry Rd and NC-54 have been issued a trespass enforcement order by Carrboro Police Department at the request of a local property owner. The Street Outreach Harm Reduction and Deflection team has been and will continue to serve unsheltered neighbors. SOHRAD also works with local business owners and stakeholders to address concerns while using harm reduction and housing first approaches. OCPEH will consider options to better serve unsheltered neighbors while reducing harm. Options could include forming an Unsheltered Workgroup, developing an Encampment Policy or Values Pledge, and asking stakeholders to sign on.
