Inter-Faith Council for Social Services

Project Will Fund: 18 Permanent Supportive Housing units that serve 18 Chronically Homeless Single Adults along with essential Supportive Services

Without funding, would create a gap in the homeless services system and is a best practice program.

2.

Orange County Partnership to End Homelessness

Supportive Services Only – Coordinated Entry, system wide impact for all persons at risk of or currently experiencing a homeless episode

Funds will support full system implementation of 2.5 FTE to assist people accessing homeless services, being assessed for programs, and program referrals

Reallocation of funds to fully fill system gap identified in 2017-18.

3.

Compass Center

Rapid Re-housing for DV Survivors and their Families

Will provide rental assistance and essential supportive services for 2 adults and two children that are survivors of domestic violence

First funded in the 2018 CoC/NOFA competition

4.

Community Link

Provides Permanent Supportive Housing and Supportive Services to adults with and without children.

This project is being reduced as it's currently not meeting HUD threshold and funds will be reallocated to request funding for Coordinated Entry.

Staff will work with Community Link to ensure minimal impact and to avoid displacement of persons currently stably housed.

5.

Compass Center

*DV Bonus – Expand current Rapid Rehousing Project to serve DV survivors and their families.

Expansion will fund additional rental assistance for 2 adults and 2 children.

HUD allows CoC's to apply for Bonus Projects as a way to increase the annual renewal demand. Additional funding will fill the gap of not having a DV Shelter in Orange.
