## Gap of the Month: Street Outreach



### Street Outreach Program


- · Connects people living unsheltered with services and housing
  - · Relationship-based; trauma-informed; client-centered
  - Program focus is connection, not on-going case management
  - Work is done in community, where people living unsheltered hang out/live
- Funding target: \$80,154
- Status: Unfunded
  - Community partner meetings in 2017-2018 resulted in program budget & hosting agency, UNC Center for Excellence in Community Mental Health
- Strategy: Eligible ESG program; Foundations; Targeted stakeholders?

## Street outreach eases path to housing for people with long history of homelessness

- Decrease system-wide length of time homeless
- Better system-wide data included in HUD-required System Performance Measures

## Revised 2019-2020 Plan to End Homelessness



## 2019-2020 Plan revisions underway

- In December, Leadership Team members asked for more clarity on connections between proposed Action Items and long term goals
- · Delayed a few months by other agenda items



### 12 Action Items Proposed

- Develop messaging about OCPEH work, gaps in the homeless service system, and Orange County homeless data
- Educate Leadership Team and other community members about homeless service system gaps analysis through Homelessness 201 presentation
- 3. Develop ongoing project data review and project performance improvement
- 4. Work with public housing authorities to develop Move On from PSH strategies
- Develop partnerships with three affordable housing providers to take referrals directly from OC Connect, coordinated entry
- Work with local governments and foundations to require new affordable housing developments to take referrals directly from OC Connect, coordinated entry
- Work with other human service agencies to transform human services to become traumainformed system in Orange County
- Conduct data analysis on racial disparities related to homelessness and present this info alongside annual Community Data Review event
- To better reflect the people being served in the Orange County homeless service system, increase percentage of African-Americans on the OCPEH Leadership Team from 19% to at least 35
- Conduct evaluation of coordinated entry
- Develop a plan in coordination with faith-based and other community groups about transferring administration of Project Connect from OCPEH to other agency or group
- 12. Conduct listening sessions with different stakeholder groups
